DESTiny application nominated for international award

The Dairy Environment Sustainability Tool (DESTiny), which helps dairy producers estimate the net carbon footprint of different production options and identify the most sustainable and environmentally efficient farm management systems, was nominated by the International Dairy Federation (IDF) for this year's Innovation Award – the nomination fell under the category of sustainable farming practices. The winner will be announced on 21 October at the World Dairy Summit in Santiago, Chile.

The DESTiny application, a project of Milk SA, was developed in cooperation with ASSET Research. The research project is currently in its second phase, which includes to convey practical insights from the findings to dairy producers, consultants, and the like. Riana Reinecke, who is working on her PhD in sustainable milk production at Stellenbosch University, is the research leader. Congratulations, Riana!

SANAS accreditation for the DSA
